






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A Letter From the President



ABOUT THE PROGRAM

"There's No Place Like Home" is a celebration of regional talent, diverse works and composers, and fantastic music ranging from bombastic, fun, and familiar to subtle, profound, and adventurous. That duality is my musical "home." I'm thrilled to be able to share this music with you and this stage with all these musicians.

All the composers and arrangers on the first half have some connection to the region. Aleks, Derek, Chen Yi, and Ingrid all work and teach locally. Jim Barnes is recently retired from KU, Dan is a recent graduate from UMKC, Randall is a professional composer living in Arkansas, and Claude T. Smith—a native Missourian—was one of the most prominent composers of the mid-twentieth century. Even our world-class soloist Ali Wright (though he hails from Britain) studies in Kansas City and teaches at the University of Central Missouri. All of this is to say the Midwest has a vibrant, creative spark.

Antiphonal Fanfare is a rollicking start to the program with scalar passages deriving from Gustav Holst's famous Second Suite in F. The familiar strains of Harold Arlen's immortal The Wizard Oz songs are assembled in a stellar arrangement by James Barnes. We Seven is a journey into the cosmos with the Mercury 7 astronauts as they blast off into space and then look back toward their home planet while using Puccini to unwind. Spring Festival is as boisterous and inviting as its composer, my dear teacher, and mentor Chen Yi. Energetic, contrapuntal tangos emerge as the imagined partners in Dusk Dances become freer and more infatuated with one another. Like Derek's We Seven, Ingrid's Into the Blue, "invokes thoughts of a journey into the unknown, an openness toward new possibility... The unexpected is embraced, spontaneous detours are celebrated and we journey together..." In a nod to apocryphal Missouri history, the phrase "Man's Best Friend" was first used in the court case involving the farm dog Old Drum in Warrensburg, MO, so we lighten things up with That Old Hound Dog Rag. Recent finalist in the Jean-Marie Londeix International Saxophone Competition Ali Wright solos on Claude T. Smith's Fantasia for Alto Saxophone. It is a tornadic tour de force of the repertoire that displays Ali's tremendous skill and Smith's impeccable writing.

The second half is more far-reaching than local, but the works all tie back to Midwestern imagery, homeward journeys, or memories. The music to Tony-winning *Cabaret* was composed by Kansas Citian John Kander. Plus we get the added benefit of paying homage to mother-daughter queens Judy and Liza on the same program! Grammy- and Pulitzer Prize-winning Jennifer Higdon, Barr Laureate composer at the University of Missouri-Kansas City, captures fleeting glimpses out of train windows in *Rail Lights*. Aaron Copland's populist Americana period is evident in his gorgeous "Promise of Living" from the opera *The Tender Land* about a Midwestern farming family. The manuscript to the two-step march *American Parade* by French composer Charles Gourdin is housed in Kansas City's National World War I Museum and Memorial. This selection is equally special as it is receiving its American premiere tonight, 100 years after it was composed for a Fourth of July

celebration at the American Hospital in Beaune, Côte d'Or, France. Surinach was one of the champions of the musical style of brutalism, but typically tempered this brashness with newly composed folk-like melodies. *Memories of an Old Zarzuela* is the rare instance in which he uses an actual pre-existing melody, in this case Asenjo Barbieri's comedic three-act Spanish opera, *El barberillo de Lavapiés*, as basis for a new piece. In *The Nine*, Randall, like Surinach, channels music tradition, yet this time in the style of a newly composed Spiritual to guide the listener through a pivotal moment in civil rights, the integration of Little Rock Central High School in 1957. The program concludes with Carmen Dragon's lush arrangement of *America*, *the Beautiful*.

I'll leave you with the inscription in the score of *We Seven* as it's perfectly adaptable and appropriate for this evening's concert and beyond.

"How many things have been denied one day, only to become realities the next!"

Mission of the LGBA

The purpose of the Lesbian and Gay Band Association is to promote LGBT Music, Visibility, and Pride for all by:

- * Providing an international network of LGBT and affirming bands in all stages of development;
- * Promoting music as a medium of communication among people;
- *Improving the quality of artistic and organizational aspects of member bands; and
- * Stimulating public interest in the unique art form of community bands in our culture for all.

Bringing Pride and Understanding Through Music

Great performances are the most visible manifestation of the LGBT+ band movement. Member bands across the country appear in hundreds of concerts, parades, and community events every year. Member bands in geographic proximity often perform together, and a typical marching schedule will include Pride Parades in several different cities.

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Pride In Every Note

Alan Day and Zachary Parker began discussing the formation of a band during the summer of 2001. Originally planned as a senior Drum & Bugle Corp, the founders decided to shift focus into becoming a performing musical organization focused on Kansas City's LGBTQ community. Mid America Freedom Band held its first rehearsal on April 18, 2002 at the Lesbian and Gay Community Center in Kansas City with four musicians. That same year MAFB also became proud full member of the Lesbian and Gay Band Association an organization complied of now over 35 similar bands across the United States and internationally.

On November 15, 2003 MAFB, under the leadership of Zachary Parker, gave its first concert, "Journeys" with only 13 local musicians aided by St. Louis' BandTogether. In 2004 Mid America Freedom Band became incorporated as a non-profit entity and a board of directors took office in 2005. In 2006 the band added an annual holiday concert to the fall and spring season, as well as many other outreach events. The band that once numbered barely a half dozen now has approximately 80+ members, and includes a volunteer rest section, concert band, marching/pep band, and award-winning jazz band, The Mighty Mo Combo.

In addition to a regularly scheduled concert season, MAFB performs in outreach events in churches, nursing homes, parks, prides and parades in front of over 80,000 Kansas Citians annually. The organization believes producing high-quality performances that are entertaining and accessible to all walks of life, while creating a safe, fun, and supportive atmosphere for its members and patrons.

Our upcoming 16th season performances will be in our new concert home, The Medallion Theater at Plexpod Westport Commons, with our partnership with the National World War I Museum and Memorial continuing with our February 2019 educational concert. The theme for next season, "Colors," stems from those of the LGBT rainbow flag to shimmering metallics of the holidays and stark black-and-white photography of World War I.
